On Monday, February 29, 2016 from 3:00-4:00 pm ET, Drs. Nina Wallerstein and Bonnie Duran will present “CBPR and Community Engaged Research: Facilitating Implementation Science Outcomes”. The presentation will report on results of a national cross-site study to test a CBPR model and assess the relationship between participatory research practices and implementation science and other CBPR and health outcomes. They will showcase continuing NIH-funded research to measure and assess metrics of engagement and associations with outcomes with implications for dissemination and implementation.
